The samplers they stitched, often strikingly beautiful, give us a surprising way to look into the lives of these girls, their families and the changing world around them."

Summer Flower Boxes

	Materials	Design
0	Caron Watercolours, (use 1ply of the 3-ply)	Design Count: 77w x 77h
	DMC #5 pearl cotton: bright accent color light accent color medium green	Design Size on 18 ct.: 4.25' x 4.25' Cut 18 ct. canvas: 8' x 8'
	YLI Ribbon Floss (or Kreinik's 1/16th Ribbon)	NOT E
0	Small beads	This design can also be stitched
	#22 tap estry needle 8' x 8' 18 ct. mono can vas, eggshell	on 24 count Congress Cloth with #8 pearl cotton threads.

Flower Blocks: From the center of your canvas, tent stitch the four divider lines. Then backstitch the central flower blocks. Use 1 ply of the variegated Watercolours and then 1 strand of the solid color pearl cotton threads. Add french knots and beads last.

Crossed Borders: Stitch the layers of stitches as shown on graph.

Tack down the long cross bundles with 1 strand of Ribbon Floss or a 1/16th Kreinik Ribbon.

Border Corners: Backstitch the flowers in the corners with 1 ply of the variegated Watercolours; finish with solid color pearl cottons. Add beads last.

Outer Border: Lay down long stitches with Ribbon Floss and tie down with crosses of pearl cotton. Work scalloped outer border in straight stitches with 1 strand of the medium green pearl cotton.
